

PHYSICAL THERAPY

Students must earn a bachelor's degree prior to admission to a physical therapy program. There is no preferred major. Completing the courses listed below does not result in a bachelor's degree. Additionally, students must complete the courses required by the physical therapy programs to which they plan to apply, score competitively on the Graduate Record Exam (GRE), shadow practicing physical therapists and show evidence of commitment to community service. Some types of leadership experience may be helpful.

Requirements at individual physical therapy programs vary. Students are responsible for knowing and completing the requirements of their major and those of the physical therapy programs to which they plan to apply.
